With the support of the federal Canada Student Summer Jobs Program, an assistant coordinator was hired for eight-week employment funded by Employment and Social Development Canada. The student was also hired for an additional four weeks funded by the FSDC.

The student helped to organize projects and various fundraising events, prepare, and schedule event publicity, and organize logistics.

#### **MASQUARADE PARTY**

The annual "Get into Bed with Des Collines Health Foundation" Masquerade Party was a brilliant success. Held on February 18, 2023, at the Centre Wakefield La Pêche, the event raised a net profit of \$22,900 for the Foundation, including generous donations from YWAR Rupert, Terra Construction and MCH Group (Fab Structures). **The funds raised helped buy 12 automated chairs for the CHSLD.** The organizing committee of local volunteers orchestrated a truly remarkable event that has now solidified its standing as one of the most innovative and creative occasions to grace Wakefield in recent years.

#### WAKEFIELD HOSPITAL GOLF TOURNAMENT

The 28th Annual Wakefield Hospital Golf Tournament, sponsored by Famille Charles IGA and other businesses, hosted 132 golfers on June 9, 2023, at Mont Cascades Golf Club. The event raised \$21,100, aiding in the purchase of a Bladder Scanner for the CHSLD and a Vascular Doppler for CLSCs in Masham and Val-des-Mont. We extend sincere thanks to Famille Charles IGA for their invaluable support and, to the tournament committee and the unwavering dedication of countless volunteers and sponsors.

### **ONLINE AUCTION, by the Boutique Sante**

In 2023, Pamela Scobie spearheaded an online auction alongside dedicated volunteers from Boutique Sante, resulting in a remarkable success story. Their efforts garnered an impressive **\$7,222** showcasing the power of community engagement and charitable giving.

#### **ANNUAL HOSPITAL GARDEN PARTY**

In 2023, Pamela Scobie and Jane Earle took the helm with unwavering dedication as lead volunteers for the Hospital Garden Party. Each dedicated an impressive number of hours of their time to ensure the event's success. Their leadership was bolstered by a team of 84 volunteers who collectively invested around 252 hours of effort, averaging about 3 hours each. This combined effort amounted to approximately 360 volunteer hours, underscoring the community's steadfast commitment to the cause. Their collaborative efforts resulted in net proceeds of \$3,100 from the garden party, showcasing the substantial impact generated through their hard work and the generosity of donors.

### **CHRISTMAS CRAFT FAIR**

Thanks to our community's collective efforts and unwavering support, the 2023 Craft Fair achieved a remarkable milestone, raising \$15,500. This success was made possible through the invaluable support and collaboration of the *Meredith Centre* and the *Chelsea Foundation*, marking a first in the fair's history for accessibility and inclusivity. It provided an opportunity for diverse communities to converge and participate. Volunteers Laurie Garbutt, Lynne Evenson, and Angela Jeffries, alongside Board members Helen MacKinnon, Pamela Faulkner, Louise Killens, and Amanda Dexter, played pivotal roles, exemplifying teamwork, and community engagement. We also thank *Century 21 Macintyre Inc.* and *Kunstadt Sports* for their generous support.

#### **HOLIDAY APPEAL CAMPAIGN**

Together, we are making a meaningful impact in our community through initiatives like the Holiday Annual Appeal. In 2023, the appeal raised **\$25,100**. The collective efforts and leadership from directors, Pam Falkner, Amanda Dexter, Ned Ellis and Louise Killens were invaluable in

driving the success of this critical fundraising initiative. The process this year was notably smoother and more efficient, largely due to Pam F.'s involvement. Her expertise and commitment made a significant difference and contributed to a more streamlined operation. We are actively addressing some clean-up with our donor data to ensure the accuracy and completeness of our records.

# **BOUTIQUE SANTÉ COMMITTEE**

We extend our warm thanks to the many volunteers, who have dedicated years of service to patients and staff of the Wakefield Memorial Hospital. From its proceeds, the Boutique donated \$8,000 to the Foundation, a much-appreciated gift. The Boutique is operated year-round by a group of over 50 volunteers from six local communities: Wakefield, Cantley, Chelsea, Masham, Low and Farm Point. We extend our warm thanks to these many volunteers who strive to provide an important service at the Wakefield Memorial Hospital. Four positions on the Boutique's Committee will be vacant effective January 1st, 2025.

#### PROJECTS SUPPORTED BY THE FOUNDATION

In 2023, the Foundation gifted over \$38,400 to fund:
